Father Earth

As America grapples with ecology and the economy, a New Mexico architect plays with tires and dirt. And disciples call his earth ships home.

TAOS, N.M. — About 10 miles west of Taos, a road with no more signs off into the far tumbledown beneath the Taos Desert, three small vehicles peek from the road disappear strategy. All that remains is a thick carpet of snow and a set of copper tracks plinking toward infinity.

If you can envision an alternative Reynolds here, you don't need a road. This, a liquid winter morning, recently found Michael Reynolds, a six-foot-tall, wiry, bearded man of architecture, barreling through the snowdrifts, his Dodge pickup snowing every which way, destined for an irregular pile of tires and dirt, his new Atlantic Oceanfront home.

And so, in the New Year begins, changing the world has come down to this: a Taos morning like with cold, a 47-year-old man with

1987. Old tires and four cars, the essence of 20th-century civilization, are Mr. Reynolds's building blocks.

Byway hair and a patchy beard, Reynolds has used tires — the detritus of 20th-century civilization and building blocks of a new world.

There is an acronym for the Social Transformation Movement Republic, a 1,300-acre self-sufficient community for around 300 people that Mr. Reynolds, a renegade player in the alternative-housing movement, is building on a sagebrush-flecked prairie of Taos.

It begins as far as will be what Mr. Reynolds has discovered "the ships," dwellings made of stacked earth and tires that the area has been perfecting it and around Taos for the last 30 years. Michael — already realized as another project nearby — is to be

independent of the conventional power grid. Instead of being heated by electricity, the earth ships will use stacked earth, fire walls and the sun, which also powers the photovoltaic cells that provide electricity. Rather than conventional plumbing, there will be rain-water roof systems to harvest and filter runoff from snow and rain. Used water from bathtubs and sinks will be piped into jugsy planters where flowers and vegetables grow. There will be no sewers — only water toilets, an innovation of Mr. Reynolds that induces human waste to drain, that the "may even be good for something," he said.

Mr. Reynolds called this a revolution, rather than a housing development, and had already threatened to sue the United States if Government authorities try to intervene. He talks fast and intelligently. His main objective of that, according to the conservative's articles of association, will be to "create harmony and an urban farmstead." The urban farmstead, he said, will be "full democracy, full democracy."

Mr. Reynolds doesn't think of himself as a guru, though when the topic must be brook and watch his column, he doesn't particularly look like one, either, jutting around his office in a long-sleeved and wool socks with toes poking through, or being engaged in his somewhat hairy redwooder over-protecting, much, proof "you can build these

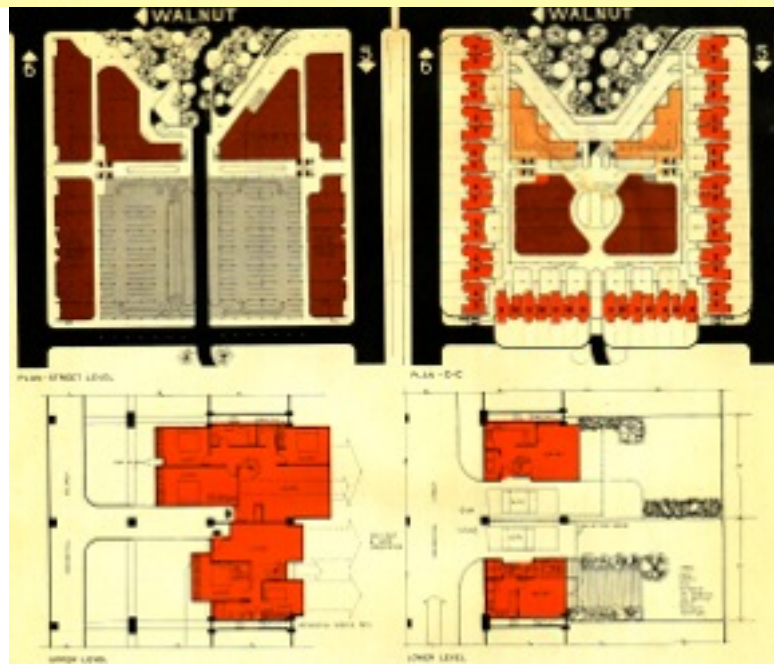

2 Residential blanket scheme: rethinking the city's architecture, and adding to its land

The scheme shown here is a proposal for new ways to work and live in the city. Its basis is a permanent, pyramid/platonic system—a "land assemblage"—established over full square blocks of our densely populated downtown cores. Or perhaps they are not so densely populated: the downtowns of some of our cities are becoming nearly parking lots, geared to the worker in suburbia.

The scheme is the work of a young designer named Michael E. Reynolds, who now lives and works in Tempe, New Mexico. He is trained as an architect, and he has been refining his drawings and ideas about cities for several years. His ideas here are hardly visionary; that is, they take as their goal the creation of a better way for people to live in a high-density environment, and disregard all of the existing building codes, zoning systems, patterns of private ownership, and transportation techniques that restrict that vision. But at the same time, it does not override all

that man has built lately, as we could perhaps describe Paolo Soleri's ecologies as doing. This scheme resembles Soleri's work in its vision and in its goals, but not in its scope and breadth. Reynolds' land assemblage describes a way of improving existing cities, proposes that their existing rectilinear block patterns be retained, and most of all, provides a central position for the automobile. It attempts to make the United States system of individual, private transportation capable that can go anywhere anytime, work in a more humane way.

The drawings on this page describe one possible form of his residential blanket in its "land assemblage" framework, and the views of sketches on the following page illustrate the utopia he has followed. But let Mr. Reynolds speak for himself: "I am proposing a housing scheme that will provide suburban amenities such as an exterior yard, auto parking next to your door, freedom to change your living space, psychological distance from the

city, and community identity. These amenities will be within walking distance of the activities of city life such as entertainment, shopping, employment, cultural concentration and civic exchange.

"The commercial potential of a square block of any city is too valuable to be replaced with a residential complex. At the same time, however, the commercial potential of a city core would be greatly increased if the residential complex were there to make use of it. As it is now, the existing residential areas are providing their own commercial facilities in our suburbs. These suburban cities compete with and weaken our existing city cores. As a result, our city cores are losing their strength symbolically and physically. Therefore, I am proposing a residential blanket over a commercial complex in the city core. This residential blanket would increase the usable land area by creating land areas stacked or overlapped above ground. They would be assembled in such a way that
